As a result of assessing CCBC's standing, the ministry leadership saw the need of expanding in the areas of the prayer life that brings personal growth, personal growth that leads to Christian service, and service that bears fruit of new disciples for Christ.

CCBC's disciple-making pathway becomes the tool for the leaders to determine the strategy. The pathway is to **Connect** with people around us so that they can hear and believe the gospel of Christ. And then we help these new believers to **Conform** to the likeness of Christ through the process of disciple-making in the context of a loving church community. And those maturing followers of Christ are **Built up** and equipped to serve Christ in His **Commission**.

CCBC currently has around 400 maturing disciples. These are people who know Christ as Savior and are experiencing small victories in their faith-walk. They are maturing disciples. This generation of CCBCers ought to be challenged to step up in their faith and be trained to serve in whatever capacity the LORD has given them to engage in bringing others to know Christ and the power of His resurrection.

We have a corps of 150 leaders, who have the sense of calling to lead a small group, to nurture a flock of disciples, to be trainers of soul-winners, to be teachers of the Bible to different people, and to be coaches for new leaders, and to be catalysts so that others will participate in what Christ is doing among CCBCers in our society today.

This is CCBC's current asset that the LORD may cause to \mathbf{E} **PAND.**

At first, he hesitated and made many excuses, but I persisted. Thank God, he finally joined me. Meeting the parolees significantly changed him. He felt a burden to serve the Lord and be dedicated to the Ministry. Now, he is an ROTH volunteer, making weekly visits to our clients, sharing true spiritual guidance in Christ, and offering prayer with hope and encouragement."

CONFORM TO CHRIST CCBC KIDS

2025 is a blessed year for CCBC Kids! We are able to disciple the kids in the classroom setting, some weekly, some twice a month, & others monthly. We enjoyed the Daily Vacation Bible school: "True North", a well-loved church family reunion or fiesta. We are able to train teachers with basic teachers training and monthly equipping sessions. Also, we had a parent-child workshop in the middle of the year and more.

Discipleship in Classroom setting (SS, AWANA, VIC, JASMS Interfaith, DVBS)

- Sunday School 2025: Total enlisted kids = 86 students and 15 teachers & staff (An average of 39 students (January – Oct.) Plus "Kids Can Help" Coin Bank
- AWANA 2025 total 80+ clubbers, 6 Junior Leaders & 13 AWANA leaders
- Daily Vacation Bible School 2025 total 141 students & 98 volunteers
- JASMS Interfaith 2025 total of 16 Gr. 3-6 students; 1 teacher
- VIC 2025 in Sto. Cristo Elementary School; Bungad ES; Kalantiaw ES = Total of 824 students in 23 sections; 14 teachers *Some VIC teachers have started CPR with their class advisers
- Teaching & Discipling Children Workshop = 6 trainees completed the workshop
- Kids Ministry Leaders Equipping = 7 Equipping sessions;
 Average of 22 participants; 1 facilitator
- Parent-child workshop "Let's Talk About Sex" with 5 pairs invited by CCBC; 5 pairs part of another church
- Volunteers are part of Life Groups, a safe place.
- Children have a safe place in the company of our volunteer teachers or leaders and their peers.

For 2026, we pray that CCBC Kids will have another fruitful year ahead with this vision.

In our pursuit to expand, we will continue to excel in our weekly fellowships, where more and more youth will grow and exercise their gifts in Forward Youth and across CCBC. We will deepen our walk with God through a series of prayer gatherings and a youth version of the Set Free Retreat that will enrich our lives together and teach the youth about the beauty and necessity of communal prayer and inner healing. We will continue training potential shepherds and nourishing our youth shepherds through regular mentoring and accountability. We're also praying to explore new community and/or campus partnerships that will eventually lead to simple church

Through YAM Camp 2025: Rekindle, the Lord stirred our hearts back to Him and strengthened our relationships with one another. CONFORM TO CHRIST WORSHIP MINISTRY

Over the past year, the Worship Ministry has experienced remarkable growth—not only in our knowledge of God's Word but also in our meditation and application of it. This spiritual deepening went hand in hand with the development of our skills, made possible through consistent weekly devotions, Bible studies, and mentoring. Our ushering teams also underwent intensive training on proper handling of situations and ushering attendees, coupled with a worship heart check. A highlight of the year was conducting an authentic Worship Workshop with a daughter church team, strengthening relationships, unity, and their worship journey.

Conform to Christ

- 86 actively serving in the ushers' ministry
- 47 actively serving in the music and tech ministry
- 5 newly committed ushers
- 1 newly committed tech minister

Build to Serve:

- 25 completed the Worship University Training
- 5 worship ministers from San Luis Batangas completed a Essentials in Worship Workshop
- 41 completed the Ushers' Training / Workshop

Looking ahead to 2026, we envision deepening the relationships among our ministers through heartfelt fellowships and rebuilding connections with inactive members through intentional one-on-one meetings. We also aim to expand the reach of our training by developing online versions of our workshops—resources that can serve not just our church but our daughter churches and others who may benefit, potentially as paid offerings. Through these fellowships and training initiatives, we hope to strengthen volunteer commitment, inspire new members to join the ministry, and welcome more worshippers as we launch our 3rd worship service to further expand our reach.

CONFORM TO CHRIST PRAYER MINISTRY

At Capitol City Baptist Church, we believe prayer is not just a practice—it is the power cell that keeps our church moving, serving, and growing. And this year, we've seen again how God truly works when His people come to Him in prayer.

Every Wednesday night, a steady group gathers for Mid-week Encounter with God (MEG). It's a small circle, but a strong one—men and women who have walked with the Lord for years. Their conversations run deep, their insights sharpen one another, and their prayers are bold. Week after week, this group quietly supports the church in ways many do not see.

Saturday Dawn Prayer (SDP) has become another anchor point for our church family. From 6:00am to 7:30am, about forty-five people—both Deaf and hearing—show up to seek God together. Our weekly prayer themes follow the Sunday sermons, helping the participants connect more with the Word being preached. Four prayer leaders take turns supported by a diligent Filipino Sign Language interpreter. This year, our Deaf members have stepped up, praying and participating more actively in the big group. Their presence and passion have strengthened the whole gathering.


During Sunday worship, different members take turns leading the entire church in congregational prayer. These moments have reminded us that prayer is not the work of a few—it's the shared responsibility and privilege of a church.



This year has been full of gentle but exciting growth for the Capitol City Baptist Church Deaf community. Our Sunday gatherings—whether online or face-to-face—now bring together around 50 Deaf members, with others joining from different provinces, even the US and Canada. It's amazing to see how people keep finding their way into this warm, welcoming circle.

Pastor Julius and May Andrada continue to lead the ministry with their steady, caring presence. They're the kind of leaders who don't need to be in the spotlight—they just quietly show up, teach, visit, and care. One of this year's big moments was their trip to Brazil for the first-ever World Deaf Christian Conference. They came home with new ideas, fresh energy, and a renewed sense that our Deaf community is part of something global and meaningful.

As our group grows, one challenge is becoming clear: we need more trained Deaf leaders. The heart of our long-term dream is simple—small groups where Deaf members can share life, ask questions, study the Bible together, and eventually lead others.

And yes, we're dreaming big. Another vision, the Ezra Project, hopes to create Bible video resources made especially for the Deaf. It's a huge undertaking, but one we're excited to explore.

We've also seen small but beautiful victories. Several Deaf members who used to say "I don't know how to pray" can do so now and even lead prayers during Saturday Dawn Prayer via Zoom, where Deaf and hearing members bow their heads together.

Our interpreter team grew too! One new volunteer joined this year. She admitted her hands fumble and her knees shake, but she still stepped forward, trusting that the Lord can multiply little offerings.

Looking back, we're grateful.

Looking ahead, we're excited. The CCBC Deaf Ministry is growing—not just in number, but in hope. And the best chapters are still to come.

BUILD TO SERVE DISCIPLESHIP & TRAINING

CCBC continues to provide strong avenues for growth through Life Essentials—

Kairos, Women Who Make a Difference, Personal Holiness, and Courageous.

Last March, we celebrated an encouraging 80% participation in our 40 Days of the Word campaign.

In May, we held the School of Shepherds with 12 potential leaders, four of whom have already started their own small groups.

This year, we also launched a new young couples fellowship with the help of Albert and Marife Palima and conducted two Set Free Retreats, one in CCBC and another in Hong Kong. Our 100 connect groups, life groups, and life communities continue meeting faithfully, offering care and spiritual growth to the flock.



As we move into 2026 with the theme EXPAND, we anticipate God enlarging our reach, our capacity, and our impact in discipleship and training.



Under **Built to Serve**, we are praying to raise 70 new shepherds to lead Connect and Life Groups, and equip 40 more leaders through Leadership Essentials. We are planning to add 6 new core members in the Ministry Team who will help lead the discipleship movement in CCBC, and we aim to establish at least 20 simple churches beyond our walls.

In the area of **Conform**, we are trusting God that we would be able to assimilate 100 people into small groups and guide 200 CCBCers through Life Essentials.

With God's grace, 2026 will be a year of true expansion.

CCBC 2025 WWL Year-End Ministry Report

This year, the Witnessing as a Way of Life (WWL) Ministry witnessed God's quiet but unmistakable work in the lives of our members and the people they meet every day. With a spirit of gratefulness and a steady resolve to move forward, the ministry continues to help ordinary believers discover that simple conversations—at home, at work, or in the neighborhood—can open wide doors for God to touch a life.

WWL offered two levels of training again this year: Level 1, which focuses on basic witnessing skills, and Level 2, which teaches believers how to gently nurture new followers of Jesus.

In 2025, WWL held two batches of Level 1. Batch 5 graduated 16 trainees last May, while Batch 6 is ongoing with 14 participants who will complete their training this December. Many of them are already applying what they have learned in real-life moments with family, friends, and coworkers.

Our leaders also invested in their growth. Wealth Boydon and Amie Urquia attended a WWL Leadership Training in April. Then in August, 30 trainers joined the WWL Trainers Retreat at Tanawan Haven —an encouraging time of prayer, learning, and renewed commitment.

The ministry also created connecting events where friendships could form naturally. Twenty-two (22) guests attended the Spiritual Birthday Party, while Parentips, our parenting seminar, welcomed twenty-eight (28) parents from Barangay Bungad—many of whom heard the gospel for the first time.

For Batch 6, Bible studies for ten new believers are now ongoing.

As we look to the coming year, may we celebrate what God has begun—and may more of us step forward, take part, and allow God to use our everyday conversations to bring His light to someone's life.



COMISSIONED TO MULTIPLY MISSIONS

Our mission remains the same: to "make disciples of all nations." CCBC is a missional church, known in the Christian community as a missionary-sending church. This isn't a point of pride, but a calling we must pass on to the next generation. Let's not forget our roots as a missional church. CCBC is called, just as Jesus' disciples were called and commissioned, to make disciples of all nations.

Currently, we support 35 missionaries and 11 missions organizations, including CBAP – Conservative Baptist Association of the Philippines. In 2025, our goal was to raise P2-Million to support them, but from January to October of this year, we raised only P1 Million. We are praying that in the next two months, we can raise additional funds to meet their needs.

In 2026, as part of MCare (Missionary Care), one of our key initiatives is to visit both our local and international missionaries. We will be accompanied by CCBC members who are willing and ready to experience mission work firsthand. The main purposes of these visits are to encourage our missionaries and to provide our members with an opportunity to witness their ministries in action.





COMMISIONED TO MULTIPLY OUTREACH & CHURCH PLANTING

In Matthew 9:37, Jesus said, "The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few," highlighting the need for more workers. Some of our pastors have noted that the laborers are not only few but also aging. In the past few months, since returning from my sabbatical, I resumed visiting and encouraging our workers in the field. Many of them are undergoing transitions, marking fresh beginnings.

Recently, our pastor in CCBC Kansurok moved to CCBC Balogo, his hometown. The pastor from Balogo moved to Bonliw, and the one from Bonliw is now in Kansurok. Additionally, our church in CCBC Praiseland in Buenavista currently has no pastor, representing another transition for that church.



Furthermore, our churches in Bacacay and Pasong Tamo are in the process of leadership succession. There are valid reasons for these changes, which are beneficial to both the pastors and the churches they serve.

On a positive note, we praise God for the growth and multiplication of the work in Morong Rizal, Lemery & San Luis Batangas. The church in Lemery has established daughter churches in Calaca and Bañaga Batangas and continues to expand by reaching other barangays in the area.

Our focus for 2026 is Prayer, Growth, and Service. We aim to equip our pastors in the field through training, mentoring, and discipleship. Regular outreach visitations will be conducted to encourage, challenge, train and mentor our workers. This also serves as a way to disciple the next generation, inviting them to participate in and witness the outreach ministry.

As we close 2025, we look back with deep gratitude for how God has been leading Capitol City Baptist Church through the Haggai Mandate—His clear call for us to rise, rebuild, and put His work first (Haggai 1). What began as a faith-stretching vision is now unfolding before our eyes.

Several milestones marked this year. In July, we held our historic groundbreaking, followed by the closing of our old worship hall. Since then, our worship services and many ministries have joyfully gathered under the tent. What could have been a season of discomfort has instead become one of unity, beauty, and celebration. The church family—young and old—has embraced it with courage, hope, and a contagious excitement.

Two major teams have carried the work forward. The Technical Team, led by Architects Bianca Sebastian and Beng Gaviño, meets weekly to refine the design and work closely with suppliers. Our upcoming three-floor building—with three levels of elevated parking—will house expanded worship space, discipleship rooms, youth and children's areas, and accessible spaces that reflect our heart for the people.

We praise God for the generosity of our members and friends. Many have given sacrificially, financially, and even in kind. Skilled professionals offered their expertise at no cost. A prayer group intercedes faithfully, and even our children are joyfully involved.

After much prayer, the CCBC Board has selected Reytech Construction Company as our contractor, with construction targeted to begin in January 2026.
